Brief Overnight Closure Planned for I-95 Northbound Ramp on State Road16 Next Week

ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla. – As part of the Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) resurfacing improvements on I-95 from State Road 207 to International Golf Parkway, the I-95 northbound entrance ramp on State Road 16 will be closed Thursday, February 17 from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m., weather and schedule permitting. This brief overnight closure will allow crews to safely place a drainage pipe across the ramp within the project limits.

Drivers attempting to enter I-95 northbound from State Road 16 will be detoured via I-95 southbound to State Road 207 (Exit 311), where they can access I-95 northbound (map below).

Anderson Columbia Co., Inc. is expected to complete the \$30.2 million improvements by fall 2023. Construction completion dates are fluid and subject to change based on weather and schedule permitting.
