Construction to Start This Week on Normandy Boulevard Resurfacing Project

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Construction is beginning this week on the Florida Department of Transportation’s Normandy Boulevard resurfacing project from northeast of Lamplighter Lane to southwest of I-295.

In addition to milling and resurfacing, the project also includes some driveway reconstruction and sidewalk work as well as traffic signal and signage updates.

Traffic will be maintained in accordance with FDOT design standards throughout the project. No lane closures are allowed eastbound between 6:30 and 10:00 a.m., or within 600 feet of a signalized intersection between 5:30 a.m. and 9:30 p.m. No lane closures are allowed westbound from 5 to 7 p.m., or within 600 feet of a signalized intersection between 8 a.m. and 10 p.m.

Preferred Materials, Inc. was selected to complete this project at a cost of \$5.9 million in early 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
