### **Continuous Lane Closures at the Intersection of Beach Boulevard and Forest Boulevard Begin March 18**

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – Continuous, multi-lane closures at the intersection of Beach Boulevard (US 90) and Forest Boulevard are scheduled to begin Monday, March 18 to allow for installation of a JEA water main.

Left turn lanes from both eastbound and westbound Beach Boulevard onto Forest Boulevard will be closed continuously March 18 through April 19. Nightly lane closures of both eastbound and westbound Beach Boulevard are planned from 8:30 p.m. to 6 a.m. March 18 through March 22.

This JEA project is expected to be completed in late April, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. Motorists are advised to consider alternative routes and allow extra travel time during the construction period.
