### **Daytime Flagging Operations on U.S. 17 Scheduled Through May for Roadway Widening Construction**

**PALATKA, Fla.-** As part of the Dunn's Creek roadway widening project, daytime flagging operations currently in place on Hoot Owl Road at U.S. 17 have been extended through early May from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., weather and schedule permitting. The lane closures are necessary to complete remaining drainage work.

Daytime flagging operations will also be in place Monday, April 19 through Wednesday, April 28 in the northbound lanes of U.S. 17 from just south of Pineway Ave to just south of Horse Landing Road to construct center medians within the project limits.

The U.S. 17 widening project also features a 12-foot wide multi-use path on the east side of the road, which will connect to the newly constructed path on U.S. 17 located south of Horse Landing Road and continue across the new bridge.

GLF Construction is estimated to complete the \$36.5 million [project](#) by summer 2021. Construction completion estimates are fluid and subject to change, weather and schedule permitting.
