### **Eastbound Frontage Road Detour to Start Sept. 25 to Construct Cherry Street Roundabout**

**STARKE, Fla.** – As part of the Florida Department of Transportation’s Starke Railroad Overpass Interchange Improvements project, starting 7 a.m. on Monday, Sept. 25, the eastbound Frontage Road will be detoured, and Cherry Street access under State Road 100 will be temporarily closed to construct a roundabout. The detour and closure are expected to be in place 4 to 5 weeks, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

**Eastbound Frontage Road Detour:** The Eastbound Frontage Road will be closed between Walnut Street and Church Street. Eastbound traffic will detour south on Walnut Street and east on South Street to Church Street.

**Cherry Street Detour:** Cherry Street will be closed during the construction of the Cherry Street roundabout. Traffic should use Thompson Street as an alternative.

FDOT hired J.B. Coxwell Contracting to complete this \$23.6 million project in late 2023, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
