FDOT to Host Hybrid Public Meeting for Tentative Five-Year Work Program October 17

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and Florida's Turnpike Enterprise will hold a public hearing for the Tentative Five-Year Work Program on Tuesday, October 17. The meeting will begin with an open house from 4:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m., followed by a brief overview of the work program development process and a formal public comment period at 6 p.m. Department staff will be available to answer questions or discuss concerns for all counties in District Two.

The hearing will take place both virtually and in-person at the FDOT Urban Office Training Center located at 2198 Edison Avenue, Jacksonville, FL 32204. Project documents and virtual participation instructions are available at www.nflroads.com/vph.
