


FDOT to Host Meeting for Proposed Safety Improvements on Atlantic Boulevard, Dunn Avenue

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation will hold a hybrid public meeting to discuss proposed safety improvements on Atlantic Boulevard (State Road 10) and Dunn Avenue (State Road 104) Tuesday, Oct. 4. The meeting will include an open house from 4:30 to 6 p.m., followed by a formal public comment period at 6 p.m.

FDOT proposes modifying existing medians and installing Median Traffic Separators with the goal of reducing traffic crashes on Dunn Avenue between Biscayne Boulevard and Harts Road (top map) and Atlantic Boulevard between Anniston Road and Dibble Circle (bottom map).

Citizens may attend the meeting online at **nflroads.com/VPH** or by phone at **(562) 247-8422** (access code **716-841-116**) or in person at the FDOT Urban Office Training Center located at 2198 Edison Avenue, Jacksonville, FL 32204. FDOT staff and consultants will be available from 4:30 to 6 p.m. to answer questions and accept written comments. A formal hearing and public comment period will begin at 6 p.m.

Both virtual and in-person participants will be given equal opportunity to ask questions and make oral statements that will become part of the public meeting record. All interested persons or groups are encouraged to attend and participate. Public participation is solicited without regard to race, color, religion, gender, age, national origin, disability or familial status.
