FDOT to Host Public Meeting Next Week for Proposed Changes to Blanding Boulevard and Wells Road Intersection

ORANGE PARK, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a public meeting on April 2nd, to discuss proposed access management changes to the intersection of Blanding Boulevard (State Road 21) and Wells Road.

FDOT presented proposed access management improvements on Blanding Boulevard and Wells Road at a hybrid public meeting in September 2023. Since that time FDOT is proposing additional safety and access management improvements on Wells Road and these changes will be presented at this public meeting.

The meeting will take place virtually and in-person at the **Orange Park Library Meeting Room A** located at **2054 Plainfield Avenue, Orange Park, Florida 32073**. FDOT staff and consultants will be available from 4:30 to 6 p.m. to answer questions and accept comments. A formal presentation and public comment period will begin at 6 p.m.
