## FDOT to hold Hybrid Open House for St. Johns Avenue Project

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a hybrid construction open house Wednesday, December 8, 2021 from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. before construction begins on the intersection improvements project on St. Johns Avenue (State Road 211) from Herschel Street to Canterbury Street.

FDOT project staff will be available to answer questions and review project documents from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. online at nflroads.com/COH or by phone at (415) 655-0060, access code 601-127-909

Citizens who are unable to participate virtually or by phone may attend the meeting in person at the FDOT Urban Office Training Center at 2198 Edison Avenue, Jacksonville, FL 32204. Both virtual and in-person participants will be given equal opportunity to ask questions and view project documents.

FDOT hired American Lighting and Signalization, LLC to complete this \$1.2 million project that includes updating two signalized intersections with roundabouts at St. Johns Avenue at Herschel Street and Geraldine Drive and St. Johns Avenue at Herschel Street south of Woodmere Drive. Work will start in early January and be complete by spring 2022, weather and schedule permitting.
