

I-95 to see overnight detour as part of Your10and95 project

Jacksonville, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation will temporarily close I-95 at Park Street to remove overhead signage Saturday, May 11 from 11 p.m. until the signage is removed. The work is expected to take several hours, however, the detour is expected to be completed by 5 a.m. Drivers will be detoured to the Acosta bridge during the closure.



<u>I-95 Northbound</u>: Drivers will be detoured to the Downtown exit ramps and onto the Acosta Bridge. From the Acosta Bridge traffic will take a right onto Broad Street and then a left onto Adams Street where traffic can travel I-95 N or to I-10 West.

<u>I-95 Southbound</u>: Drivers will be detoured to Forest Street to Riverside Avenue to the Acosta Bridge where traffic can rejoin I-95 southbound.

<u>I-10 Eastbound</u>: Drivers attempting to travel onto I-95 southbound will be detoured at the I-95 Interchange to the Forest Street to Riverside Avenue to the Acosta Bridge where traffic can

rejoin I-95 southbound or continue onto I-95 north to the Union Street exit. Drivers will then turn right onto North Jefferson Street onto the Acosta Bridge where they can join I-95 southbound.

Law enforcement officers will be on site to ensure the safety of drivers and construction crews.

The \$126 million project was awarded to Archer-Western Contractors and is expected to be completed in summer 2020, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
