Nighttime Detour Planned for I-10 Eastbound Lanes at U.S. 301 Exit for Roadway Work December 12

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of the I-10 and U.S. 301 interchange improvement project, I-10 eastbound will be closed to traffic at the U.S. 301 interchange Sunday, December 12 from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., weather and schedule permitting. The closure is necessary to complete asphalt repair work.

Drivers will detour to U.S. 301 (Exit 343) and use the I-10 eastbound entrance ramp to continue to east on I-10 (map below).

Superior Construction Company began the \$65 million interchange improvement project in late February 2016 and is estimated to complete the work in summer 2023. Construction completion estimates are fluid and subject to change, weather and schedule permitting
