Nighttime Detours Planned Next Week at Southside Boulevard and U.S. 1

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of resurfacing improvements on Southside Boulevard (State Road 115) from Butler Boulevard (State Road 202) to U.S. 1 (Philips Highway), a detour at the intersection of Southside Boulevard and U.S. 1 is necessary for drainage work to be completed safely. A section of the intersection will close nightly at 9 p.m. and reopen by 6 a.m. the following morning starting Sunday, Jan. 7 through Friday, Jan. 12.

During the detour, drivers on southbound Southside Boulevard seeking to access U.S. 1 will detour north on Philips Highway and make a U-Turn. Drivers on southbound U.S. 1 will continue past Southside Boulevard and make a U-Turn to access northbound Southside Boulevard. Motorists are encouraged to use caution in the area and follow posted detour signs.

Preferred Materials, Inc. is estimated to complete the \$29 million resurfacing and intersection improvements by summer 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.


