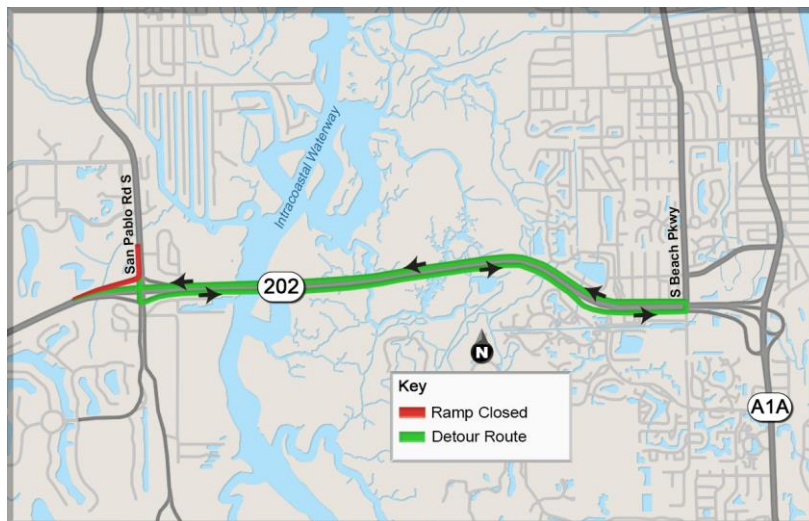

### Overnight Closure, Traffic Shift on San Pablo Road Ramp to Westbound Butler Boulevard Rescheduled for Tonight

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – Due to inclement weather, the overnight ramp closure and traffic shift on the San Pablo Road ramp to westbound Butler Boulevard originally scheduled for Sunday, September 19 have been rescheduled for tonight.

The ramp will close at 8 p.m. Monday, September 20 to allow for installation of new pavement markings. When the ramp reopens at 5 a.m. Tuesday, September 21, traffic will be shifted onto new asphalt. The ramp will close again nightly from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. on Wednesday, September 22 and Thursday, September 23 for barrier wall relocation.

During the closures, traffic will be detoured eastbound on Butler Boulevard to the South Beach Parkway exit, where motorists can access westbound Butler Boulevard (as shown in the map below).
