Overnight Closures of I-295/Beach Boulevard Ramps Planned Next Week

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of the widening and resurfacing improvement project on I-295 from J.T. Butler Boulevard (SR 202) to Beach Boulevard (SR 212), overnight closures of the I-295 northbound exit ramp to Beach Boulevard are planned Monday, April 29 to Tuesday, April 30. Additionally, closures of the I-295 southbound on-ramp from Beach Boulevard are planned Wednesday, May 1 to Thursday, May 2. The ramps will close at 10 p.m. and reopen by 5 a.m. the following morning.

Detour to I-295 Northbound: Drivers will detour via westbound Town Center Parkway, northbound St. Johns Bluff Road and eastbound Beach boulevard to access the I-295 northbound on-ramp.

Detour to I-295 Southbound: Drivers will detour via westbound Beach Boulevard, southbound St. Johns Bluff Road and eastbound Town Center Parkway to access the I-295 southbound on-ramp.

Hubbard Construction Company, Inc. is expected to complete the \$19 million improvement project in late 2024, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
