Overnight Closures on I-10 between State Road 23 and U.S. 301 Scheduled January 10 through January 13

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – I-10 eastbound and westbound lanes between U.S. 301 and State Road 23 (First Coast Expressway) are scheduled to close Monday, January 10 through Thursday, January 13 from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., for work related to the Yellow Water Road Bridge replacement project.

Monday, January 10 and Tuesday, January 11: I-10 eastbound lanes from U.S. 301 to State Road 23 will close each night at 9 p.m. and reopen by 5 a.m. the next morning.

Wednesday, January 12 and Thursday, January 13: I-10 westbound lanes from State Road 23 to U.S. 301 will close each night at 9 p.m. and reopen by 5 a.m. the next morning.

Both detours will utilize Beaver Street (U.S. 90) via the State Road 23/First Coast Expressway ramp (westbound) and via the U.S. 301 (eastbound) ramp back to I-10 (shown in map below).
