Overnight Detours Planned at I-95/I-295 North Interchange Tonight and Tomorrow

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation will detour traffic on I-95 between Max Leggett Parkway and Dunn Avenue and the I-295 exit ramps to I-95 northbound tonight and Tuesday, February 15 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m.

Drivers on I-95 northbound will be detoured onto I-295 eastbound and U.S. 17, where they can access I-95 northbound. Drivers on I-295 attempting to exit onto I-95 northbound will be detoured to U.S. 17 and Airport Road where they can access I-95 northbound.

This detour is necessary for maintenance of traffic operations as part of the I-95/I-295 North Operational Improvements Project. This project is designed to reconfigure the I-95/I-295 North interchange to improve traffic flow, safety and increase capacity.

February is “hit-and-run” awareness month in Florida. When you flee the scene of a crash, you are breaking the law, which carries serious consequences. FDOT reminds motorists to take responsibility and stay at the scene of a crash.
