### **Overnight Detours Scheduled for I-10 Widening Project**

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – As part of FDOT’s project to widen I-10 from I-295 to I-95, two separate detours are scheduled Tuesday, May 25 and Wednesday, May 26, pending weather and unforeseen circumstances.

**I-10 West Off-Ramp to U.S. 17 (Roosevelt Boulevard):** From 10 p.m. Tuesday, May 25 through 5 a.m. Wednesday, May 26, drivers who wish to take the I-10 west to U.S. 17 exit will continue on I-10 west to the McDuff Avenue exit, where they can turn left to continue to U.S. 17.

**McDuff Avenue to I-10 West On-Ramp:** From 10 p.m. Wednesday, May 26 through 5 a.m. Thursday, May 27, drivers headed north on McDuff Avenue toward I-10 west will take a left on Highway Avenue and a left on Cassat Avenue to connect with I-10 west. Drivers headed south on McDuff Avenue toward I-10 west will take I-10 east to the Stockton Street exit, take a left on Stockton Street and take a right on Irene Street to connect with I-10 west.

FDOT hired Superior Construction to complete this \$174.5 million project in early 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
