Overnight Detours at U.S. 301 and I-10 Planned June 28

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of the I-10 and U.S. 301 interchange improvement project, U.S. 301 at I-10 will be closed to traffic Monday, June 28 from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., weather and schedule permitting. The closures are necessary to complete bridge work.

The U.S. 301 northbound exit ramp from I-10 westbound will remain open to traffic.

Drivers wishing to access southbound U.S. 301 from I-10 westbound will be detoured to State Road 228 (Exit 336) to I-10 eastbound to U.S. 301.

Northbound U.S. 301 traffic will detour to I-10 eastbound and exit north on State Road 23 (Exit 350B) and travel west on U.S. 90 (Beaver Street) to access U.S. 301.

Southbound U.S. 301 traffic will detour west on I-10, exit south on State Road 228 and travel I-10 eastbound to access U.S. 301.

Nighttime lane closures will also be necessary from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

Superior Construction Company began the \$65 million interchange improvement project in late February 2016 and is estimated to complete the work in summer 2023.

Construction completion estimates are fluid and subject to change, weather and schedule permitting.
