## **Resurfacing of Lane Avenue to Begin Next Week**

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – Construction is scheduled to begin next week on 2.6 miles of Lane Avenue (State Road 103) from Wilson Boulevard to Normandy Boulevard.

The project includes removing and replacing the top layers of asphalt, concrete sidewalks, new pavement striping, new signage, and guardrail upgrades and traffic signal upgrades. This project also includes enhanced lighting and pedestrian signal upgrades at Wilson Boulevard, Wiley Road, San Juan Avenue, Hyde Grove Avenue, Manotak Avenue, Park Street, Lenox Avenue and Normandy Boulevard. In partnership with JEA, there will also be utility upgrades installed.

Traffic will be maintained in accordance with FDOT design standards throughout the project. Drivers can expect overnight, single-lane closures and daytime, single-lane closures during periods of low traffic volume. One lane in each direction will remain open at all times.

Anderson Columbia, Co., Inc. is expected to complete this \$7.9 million improvement project in spring 2023, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
