State Road 206 railroad crossing resurface set for June 19

Jacksonville – The railroad crossing on State Road 206 between I-95 and U.S. 1 is scheduled to close to replace the crossing surface. Resurfacing work and detours are expected to begin Tuesday, June 19 at 5:30 a.m. through Thursday, June 21 midnight.

Motorists wanting to travel eastbound on State Road 206 across the railroad tracks will detour north on I-95 then west on State Road 207/State Road 312 and south on U.S. 1.

Motorists wanting to travel westbound on State Road 206 across the railroad tracks will detour north on U.S. 1 then west on State Road 312/State Road 207 and exit at I-95 back to State Road 206.

Rail is an important component of a healthy economy. It is a cost-effective way to move people and goods efficiently, ultimately saving companies and people money. Rail is also a part of Florida's Strategic Intermodal System (SIS).
