Upcoming Detour for St. Johns Avenue Intersection Improvements Project

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation will detour traffic on State Road 211 starting this Thursday for construction and implementation of the new roundabout configuration of the Herschel Street intersection.

The detour is currently scheduled for Thursday, March 17 at 7 p.m. through Monday, March 21 at 5 a.m., weather and schedule permitting.

As shown in the map below, drivers will be detoured to San Juan Avenue to Roosevelt Boulevard and Edgewood Avenue South. Traffic enforcement officers will be on site to assist drivers through the new configuration.
